Good morning Councilmember Ide,

I was finally able to review the documents attached to this email which I will forward to the DOL.

I believe the statement provided by the Conservancy is inaccurate. We did not provide an engineer's report (nothing was signed and stamped as such). We performed inspection of our utilities to determine if they were the cause of the void and the Linear Infrastructure team deemed the utilities to be sound. That inspection data was provided to them after consulting with our DOL.

It is my understanding that Chris Lewis discusses with them their need and responsibility to do further due diligence to assess, determine cause and repair the void as it is private property and their responsibility.

I will forward the documents to DOL so they can opine on how to address the conservancy's notice.

Subject: Sinkhole under Piedmont Park Community Center

Commissioner Powell and Councilmember Ide,

After our conversation last week regarding the City's inspection of the sinkhole under the Piedmont Park Community Center, my understanding is clear that we (DWM) inspected the erosion and determined that it was not caused by the City's infrastructure. At that point we informed the property owner and sent them the report. The City though did not say that the issue was resolved and/or repaired. This ended our involvement.

I happened to see the PPC press release regarding the issue yesterday and am concerned that the majority of their language is vague enough to make it sound like the City signed off on the repair. I am sending this to the two of you for review because I would hate to see the City be at risk of any liability related to the issue.

Please look at this paragraph specifically:

"The void under slab has been repaired since September 28, 2018. The methods used to inspect the void, access the sewer asset and repair the void, have been deemed reasonable, and thorough by the City of Atlanta Department of Watershed Management engineers as well as the building's Engineer of Record. In addition, The City of Atlanta has conducted numerous inspections and tests on the sewer structures underneath the building and those in the area. They have provided these results to the tenant and the Conservancy. According to the Engineer

of Record's report, there are no other signs of significant soil erosion or underslab voids other than the void that has been repaired. There is no distress in the building structure or finishes that one might associate with soil settlement. Although the City of Atlanta's tests did not confirm that it was the city's asset that caused the under-slab void, having specific and current understanding of the footings, soils, soil and void repair, the Engineer of Record is confident the structure is sound and well founded. He has provided a stamped engineering report stating the same."

They do later in the release state:

"Although the City of Atlanta's tests did not confirm that it was the city's asset that caused the under-slab void, having specific and current understanding of the footings, soils, soil and void repair, the Engineer of Record is confident the structure is sound and well founded."

It seems to me that it is inferred that the City was more involved than we were.

Anyhow, I am passing this over to you.
